To apply for summer aid please complete the application on the other side of this page and return to the financial aid office as soon as you register for summer classes. Due to the short length of the summer term it is extremely important that your applications and responses to Financial Aid Office requests are immediate. Applications and information should be received before June 15, 2008.

To apply for and receive federal financial aid for the summer session you must complete or have completed the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) for the academic year in which the summer session begins. Your summer award is based on your financial eligibility and also on any remaining award for the academic year. If you attended full-time both fall and spring semester and received aid you may not have any remaining award(s). Campus-based programs (SEOG, Perkins Loan, Work-study) may be awarded, depending on eligibility and available funds. Aid will not be received in excess of maximum amounts for the academic year in each financial aid program. Award notices will be completed on a first-come, first served basis.

There is one 11 week summer session beginning May 19 and ending August 1.

Enrollment status used for financial aid purposes for the summer session is based on federal regulation:

Full-time	12 or more credit hours
$\frac{3}{4}$ time	9-11 credit hours
$\frac{1}{2}$ time	6-8 credit hours
*less than $\frac{1}{2}$ time	1-5 credit hours

*Living costs cannot be considered in determining eligibility for students attending less than half-time.

A student must be enrolled at least half-time for the summer session to be considered eligible for the Stafford Loan Program and the PLUS loan. *If your enrollment status changes before all of your courses begin, your financial aid award(s) may change.*

The first disbursement of excess aid will occur on June 2, 2008. **Disbursement will only occur for students who are determined to be meeting the WSC Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)** or have been placed on probation. SAP for the spring semester will not be monitored until grades are posted to transcripts, usually 4 to 5 days after the end of the term.

The Admission and Records office should be contacted in order to withdraw from all classes, if necessary. When a financial aid recipient withdraws from all courses, a repayment of excess aid may be required. Students who are given grades of all F's for their summer courses may be billed for any funds that are required to be returned to financial aid programs.

Refund Schedule

There will be a 100% refund of tuition and fees for **class drops** that occur during the first 8.99% of the length of the class. As an example, any class drops occurring after May 24, 2008 **for classes starting May 19 and ending August 1** will not be eligible for a refund. This date will differ depending on the start and end date of the class.

Students who are enrolled in distance education courses only may charge books to financial aid, if eligible, beginning on May 1 to allow for shipping time. On-campus students will be allowed to charge books to financial aid, only if excess aid can be expected to cover that charge, beginning May 16th. The deadline to charge books is May 23, 2008.
